ADVOCACY

Local Leaders Addressed LGBTQ+ Progress



Carthage College and the LGBT Center of SE Wisconsin co-sponsored a virtual LGBTQ+ Community Forum on February 15th. Wisconsin State Assembly Member Greta Neubauer moderated a panel with Kenosha Mayor John Antaramian, Racine Mayor Cory Mason, Wisconsin LGBT Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Jason Rae, Carthage's Director of Equity and Inclusion Roger Moreano, and LGBT Center Executive Director Barb Farrar.


The panel discussed public policy, economic development, and inclusive communities. Mayor Antaramian and Mayor Mason highlighted the recent ban on conversion therapy in both Kenosha and Racine, as well as Racine's sharp increase in LGBTQ supportive ordinances and policies in 2019. Both Mayors agreed mental health is critical to the survival of our communities.

Carthage's Roger Moreano conveyed the college's commitment to engaging students in diversity and inclusion efforts on campus and in the community. The Chamber's Jason Rae shared examples of partnering with local municipalities to create inclusive policies and highlighted SC Johnson's successes in diversity and inclusion efforts. The LGBT Center's Barb Farrar highlighted virtual programming during COVID but commented that economic realities make LGBTQ+ persons twice as likely as cisgender persons to be in poverty.




All-Ages Virtual Equality

And what is one thing we can do to continue to make our community stronger?

I think one of the most important things we can do is to continue supporting LGBTQ+ owned, as well as allied-owned, businesses. We should be spending with businesses and organizations that believe in equality, advocate for inclusion. With that, businesses that are more than 51% LGBTQ owned businesses should also be getting certified as an LGBT Business Enterprise.
