If you are interested in any type of LGBTQ+ advocacy work, whether short-term, ongoing or just for one or two events. Go <u>here</u> to signup.





QUEER BOOK CLUB

October's Read: All Boys Aren't Blue by George M. Johnson

"In a series of personal essays, prominent journalist and LGBTQIA+ activist George M. Johnson explores his childhood, adolescence, and college years in New Jersey and Virginia. From the memories of getting his teeth kicked out by bullies at age five, to flea marketing with his loving grandmother, to his first sexual relationships, this young-adult memoir weaves together the trials and triumphs faced by Black queer boys.

Both a primer for teens eager to be allies as well as a reassuring testimony for young queer men of color, *All Boys Aren't Blue* covers



topics such as gender identity, toxic masculinity, brotherhood, family, structural marginalization, consent, and Black joy. Johnson's emotionally frank style of writing will appeal directly to young adults." Goodreads.

What does the LGBTQ+ community mean to me?

The LGBTQ+ community means a place to be as I am, somewhere to be accepted as who I am, just as I am. A place I should not have to hide or mask my face, neither literally nor metaphorically. It represents a freedom that is not always found in many spaces in life.

What is the one thing we can do that will have a positive impact on our community?

Stop drawing lines within our own community, this is not a competition between sexes, identities, genders, or orientations! We all sit under the same umbrella and need to accept, respect, and protect one another. We all know what hate, exclusion, and violence feel like, let's stand together and not dismiss any of the alphabet.
