## Plans for 2023!

Happy New Year!

2023 is going to be an amazing year for the LGBT Center of SE Wisconsin for many reasons.

Thanks to the United Way of Racine County's Equity Innovation Fund, we are hiring our first Equity Coordinator to provide social events, support groups, mentorships, and leadership development to our LGBTQ communities of
 color. We want people in SE Wisconsin to know they don't have to go to Chicago or Milwaukee to find a supportive and engaging network.

We are also hiring a Youth Coordinator to help strengthen our relationships with youth to provide support, activities, and friendships with other LGBTQ+ youth. We will work with our schools to provide training and collaboration on awareness initiatives. This position will give us more capacity to have a positive impact on young people and their families.

Lastly, we are creating an Operations Manager position to help manage our day-to-day lives at the Center. This is a leadership position that helps us manage the details and oversee our new programs.

And no...money hasn't fallen from the sky! We continue to manage our budget effectively and be creative in the many ways in which we find resources to do the work that is needed.

On a more somber note, we will need everyone to fight back on our state's wave of potential conservative bills and actions that target trans youth, trans athletes, and a resurgence of parental rights legal cases that override the rights of young LGBTQ+ people.

This will be a busy year for all of us...AND...we are determined to stay strong and protect the rights of our community.

Just last week, the Wisconsin Legislative Rules Committee overturned the Wisconsin licensing rules that prohibit LGBTQ+ conversion therapy which Governor Tony Ever's put in place back in 2021. Conversion therapy is not therapy. It is a series of techniques to coerce LGBTQ+ youth to be straight and cisgender, which is detrimental and ineffective for LGBTQ+ youth. Conversion therapy has devastating and life-long negative outcomes.

Action: Please share this recent article on Conversion Therapy from WPR to raise awareness about the repeal of the ban on conversion therapy licensing.

The uneasy balance between these worlds is shattered when Starr witnesses the fatal shooting of her childhood best friend Khalil at the hands of a police officer. Khalil was unarmed.

Soon afterward, his death is a national headline. Some are calling him a thug, maybe even a drug dealer and a gangbanger.
Protesters are taking to the streets in Khalil's name.

What really went down that night? And the only person alive who can answer that is Starr.
