A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR April 4th - VOTE!

Hello friends.

If you want to make a difference this year, you will cast your ballot in the April 4th election. No, it's not a presidential election, but it will have a lasting impact on our cities and the state of Wisconsin for years to come. Local Mayoral races will determine what programs and initiatives the city prioritizes and the Wisconsin Supreme Court race will have opportunities to make legal decisions on topics such as protections for the LGBTQ+community.



At risk for our LGBTQ+ community is access to health care for trans folx, especially trans youth who need access to affirming health services. Also at risk is the right of supportive parents to advocate for the health services of their trans youth. We do not want to follow the path of states like Iowa, Missouri, Utah, and others. We have all been watching other states take away the rights of teachers, doctors, parents, and libraries that are supportive of not just the LGBTQ+ community, but social justice and human rights.

Also at risk is Wisconsin's access to abortion rights pending the State Supreme Court judge's seat which could be legalized by the court. Also at stake is party gerrymandering which could make decisions about how our voting districts are drawn to ensure fairness and equal representation, especially in urban districts with higher numbers of Black/brown voters.

On Sunday, March 26th at 3:00, the LGBT Center of SE Wisconsin will hold a listening session from Fair Wisconsin to talk about the critical issues at stake in this election. (See more information in the newsletter). This event is for the community.

March's Read: Gender Queer by Maia Kobabe

"Author Maia Kobabe explores gender identity in the 2019 graphic memoir Gender Queer, which is centered on coming out to friends and family."

"I wrote it sort of towards an audience who I

knew, like, loved me and supported me and knew me and was very sympathetic to me," Kobabe told NPR. "And I think that let me write without any, really, fear."


"Kobabe grew up in Northern California. In illustrated panels in the book, readers learn about Kobabe feeling physically different from a young age but unable to openly express it. The book has been praised in some circles for how it talks about identity — but it's also drawn a lot of rebuke from people who cite its sexually explicit nature and the illustrations."


"Gender Queer has been banned from library shelves in more states than any other book."
