Let's have a BALL!

Hello friends,

We are thrilled to announce that our program Colorful and Connected will host a ball on **September 22nd at The Branch At 1501** in Uptown Racine.

What is Ball? Start <u>here</u> with the trailer for the award-winning 1990 documentary film called "Paris Is Burning." The film was selected for preservation in the film archives of



the Library of Congress in 2016 as being culturally, historically, and aesthetically significant to our Country's history. The series "Pose" was based on Paris is Burning and ran from 2018-2021 on Netflix. Ball culture is one of the most important subculture phenomena for BIPOC LGBTQ+ folx.

Ball can be traced back to drag in the 1890s but acceptance of Black and Brown performers in typical white drag shows was not always accepted. Because of that exclusion, Black and Latine queer people created a space where free expression of their complete selves was not only possible but

celebrated. Ball as we know it took off in 1967 when Crystal LaBeija left a drag ball in protest of racial bias from the ball judges and started the first ballroom house - the House of LaBeija.

For some ball participants, "houses" or "families" serve as their only source of family. Many queer youth join balls at a young age and sometimes live in their houses if they cannot safely live with their biological family. Balls became a way for houses to raise money through competitions in order to survive. These safe and inclusive BIPOC spaces have sustained Ball culture and preserved its own unique and elaborate art form.

The Pleasure Ball in Racine will have categories for contestants to "walk" (perform a dance or strut down the runway) in order to win trophies and prizes in each competition. We have invited performers from "houses" across the Midwest but will be open to beginners as well. Please see the list of categories in order to plan your walk.

Join us as we honor this rich and unique tradition by hosting our ball, called the Pleasure Ball. Get all the details from our <u>Get all the details from our social media.</u>

The ball is open to everyone, but please be mindful of this Black and Brown space and the importance of its history.

Also, there is a youth ball from 11-3:00 PM as part of a Harm Reduction Clinic prior to the ball. **Details here.**




