What is a Needs Assessment? "A




needs assessment is the process of identifying and determining how to fill in the gaps between an organization's current and desired state."

# Event We Had A Ball!



# Youth Program Videos for RUSD

Youth Coordinator, Patricia Castillo Venegas has been working with Racine Unified School District (RUSD) to create six 3-5 minute videos to be shown to staff to bring awareness of the LGBTQ+ experience. The videos will help provide tools for staff to better



understand and support LGBTQ+ youth in schools.

The mini docu-series *From Surviving to Thriving* is a heavy yet necessary insight into the lived experiences of queer youth growing up in Racine. This first video, "The Highschool Experience for LGBT+ Students at RUSD," was envisioned to give a glimpse of the struggles LGBT+ highschoolers at RUSD face compared to the struggles of their cisgender straight peers using RUSD's 2021 Youth Risk Behavior Survey data.


"On Memorial Day of 2023, I started at the Windpoint Lighthouse and took broll footage of well-known places that make up the City of Racine. All of these locations might seem mundane or even hold happy memories for many, but for many queer youth, these locations are places where they've gone and processed very heavy mental and emotional struggles." says Castillo Venegas.


Castillo Venegas's family came to the US in 1999 and they attended RUSD. "Our experiences as queer people growing up in SE Wisconsin are unique and deserve a platform. I hope this series helps people understand the severity of the issues LGBT+ youth face, inspires them to learn more, and motivates them to take action so our kids don't have to constantly be surviving."







The intent of the event is to create an environment in which people are able to freely and respectfully express their grief, hope, and any other emotions that come up as well as provide support and a sense of community to each other.
